READING SOCIALISM.

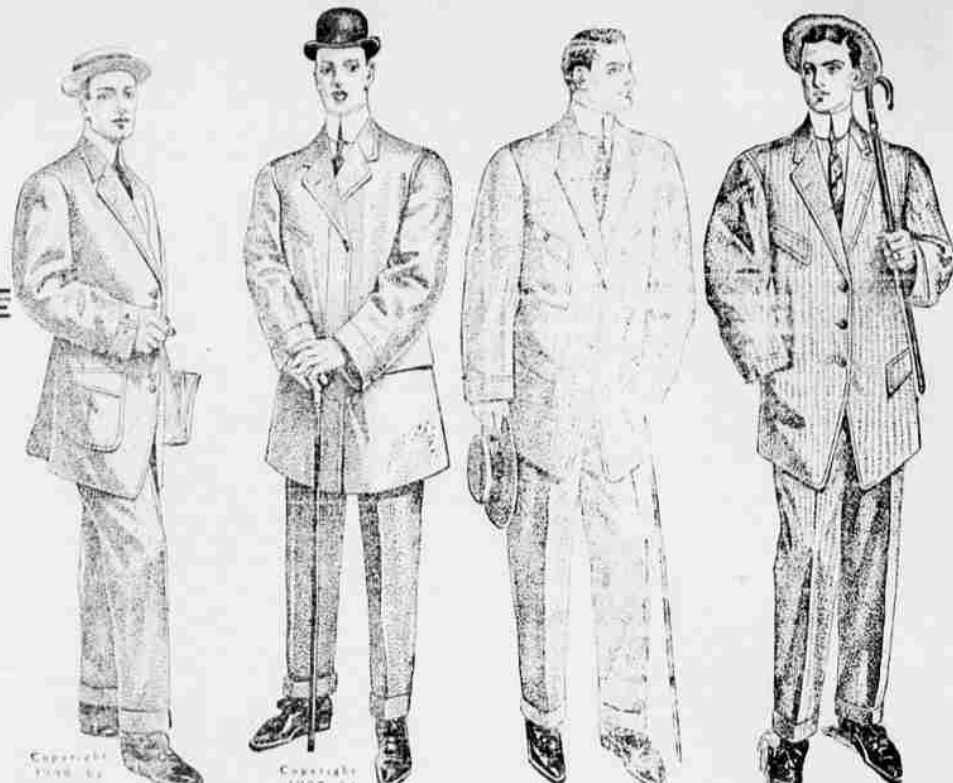
