#### JOHNSON AND CORBETT MAY MEET IN RING

CHICAGO, April 1. — "Unless Jim Jeffries gives me an answer within ten days as to whether he will box me for the championship, I'm perfectly ready to take you on for the title."

Jack Johnson thus formally agreed to meet Jim Corbett in an interview with the ex-champion just before Jack's train started for New York. Johnson was willing from the outset to the battle.

Johnson said he would post a temporary forfeit of \$1000 as soon as he reached New York. Corbett said he already had \$1000 posted with Al Smith, who resides at the Gilsey house there, but upon Johnson's request that any one of the big leading newspapers be allowed to hold the money, Corbett agreed and wired to Smith to transfer the money to any paper Johnson desired.

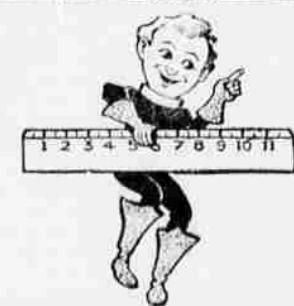
