PAINTERS UNION IS PUT UNDER WAY

Nearly 30 Members Sign Up—Application Will Be Made at Once for a Charter.

The painters, paper-hangers and decorators in and about Medford met on Saturday evening for the purpose of forming a local branch of the painters, paper-hangers and decorators' union of America. Nearly 30 members signed the roll and application for a charter will be made at once.

On next Saturday evening the members will meet and proceed to perfect their organization. All of the painters in Medford are urged to attend the meeting and sign the roll if they wish to become members. At the first meeting J. W. Kline presided and T. C. White acted as secretary and treasurer. The meeting was held in the hall of the local carpenters' union and will be held in that hall next Saturday.

For some time the carpenters' union has flourished in the city. No doubt the painters' union will prove a like success and the public should welcome it as it means that they will have reliable parties to let contracts in if they engage members of the union.

MR. EGG TO CHANGE NAME AFTER EASTER

NEW YORK, April 12—Justice O'Gorman in the supreme court today signed an order authorizing Ulrich Egg and his wife, Emilie Egg, to change their name. The Eggs are in the restaurant business and said that they could stand the joshing no longer. They wanted immediate relief, but the court's order will not go into effect until after Easter.

Mr. Egg left it to the newspaper men to say that his name had grown stale. He said that his friends kept hammering away at him, one day asking him if he was scrambled and the next if he was an omelet. Egg says these jokes soon lose their freshness. He and his wife are the only Eggs in the city directory.

Besides assisting her husband in an advisory capacity, Mrs. Egg runs a dressmaking establishment, and she says her name hurts business. After April 20 they will be known as Mr. and Mrs. Ulrich Egg.

GRAND JURY INSPECTS CANAL LABEL CASE AGAIN

NEW YORK, April 12—Inquiry into the alleged label published in connection with the Panama canal purchase was resumed by the federal grand jury here today.

Special Attorney General McNamara examined the witnesses, the first of whom was John Hodwin, a negro messenger employed by Joseph Pulitzer, proprietor of the World.

Two physicians were called to the grand jury room. One of them, Dr. George W. Hosmer, was said to be a personal friend of Joseph Pulitzer. When the grand jury adjourned today it was announced that Douglas Robinson, William Nelson Cromwell and Charles P. Taft would not be called until all the other witnesses subpoenaed had been examined.

NEW YORK BASEBALL BUG IS HAPPY AGAIN

Hard to Dope Out Wrich Teach Will Annex the Championship in American League.

NEW YORK, April 12—Hardly knowing how he managed to survive since the last world's championship baseball game, Mr. Baseball Bug will come into his own this afternoon, when the tenth season of the American league will get under way. Mr. Bug has had a hard winter of it, but reports from his various habitats today indicated that he is again in fine trim, with lungs in order and eyes far more discerning than those of the umpire.

Two factors add special interest to the American league race this year, the first being the unusual number of youngsters who are being given their first opportunity in a major league and the other the struggle of Detroit to win a third successive championship and thereby establish a record for the league.

From the Tigers' camp come ominous growls and Hughey Jennings declares that he will not have to wait this year until next to the last game before having the championship won. Lajpie's bunch looks dangerous. Cleveland has talked dangerous so often, however, only to have the legs go out, that she is not generally picked for the front seat.

Minor Manager-Fielder Jones, it is hard to figure the Chicago White Sox any stronger than last year. The White Sox bid fair to remain the "hitless wonders," winning a majority of games by brains instead of brawn.

New York will experiment with a team made up largely of youngsters and managed by George Stallings.

The Boston Red Sox will have received a heavy ante-season vote for the cellar championship, principally due to the fact that one of the first things Manager Fred Lake did after assuming control was to sell his biggest asset, the famous old battery of Young and Crig.

Washington is feeling so good over having escaped her usual position at the bottom last year that Joe Cantillon is making noise like the first division.

In the nine years that the American league has been a major organization Chicago has won the pennant three times and Boston, Philadelphia and Detroit twice each.

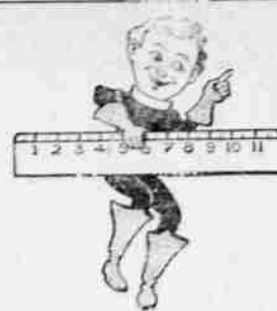
