STUDY SUBOILS BEFORE PLANTING

Irrigation Great Benefit if Favorable Conditions Exist-Under-Drainage Necessary.

The apple and pear, to be a source of profit here, should be planted on the best alluvial soils along the streams, or if the hill lands are chosen, they must be deep, and a greater depth would be better. There are no soils too good and rich to grow the best apples and pears, says A. H. Carson in his annual report as horticultural commissioner for this district. The success and pro-fits of the Rogue River valey apple and pear grower proportion to the good quality of the soil his orchards are planted n and the attention he gives to details in its management. As shal-low soil will spell failure if planted to the apple and pear, unless water is available for irrigation during the months of August and September. must be remembered that not all shallow soils are adapted to irrigation. To irrigate with profit, the subsoil must be right. If the subsoil is wrong, irrigation would be detrimental. A shallow loam soil two and one-half feet deep, resting on decomposed bedrock or broken bedrock or loose gravel would be all right for irrigation

Irrigation Beneficial

Irrigation, if intelligently done, ould be a great benefit to an apple or near orchard on such land, for he reason that the surplus water in irrigating would readily drain off through the gravel and bedrock withat injury to the growing tree, on the the other hand, should a shallow soil rest on a clay subsoil or a coment hardpan, irrigation would be detrimental to the growing of apple and pear trees. To subcessfully irrigate fruit trees on any of our soils here under drainage must be had to carry off the surplus water during the irrigation period. These shallow soils with a clay subsoil or cement hardpan can be made available for apple and pear growing by tiling to a depth of not less than five feet.

Must Understand Subsoil

Where irrigation is resorted to the ouditions of the subsoil in relation tellingently understood. The mechanical effect on shallow soils by under draininge with tile is to deepen the soil to the depth the tile is laid. Durng winter rains the surplus water where land is tiled is drained through the soil and passes off through the tile, preventing the fruit tree from njury from excessive moisture during protracted rain: storms of winter seeping it healthy and vigorous durng the dormant period, so that when it quickens into growth in the spring t is in the best possible condition to row and responds to the skill and cultivation of its owner. while the mechanical effect of under drainage is to deepen the soil and earry off the surplus moisture, paradrainage makes these shallow soils moist during the growing period. Durng the growing period the moisture-Indea air passes through the tile and its moisture is condensed and left in the soil for the growing tree. In fact with thorough, intelligent cultivation there these shallow soils are proper underdrained, but little water is ary for irrigation during the
