Ashiand, twelve miles southeast of fedford, on the Southern Pacific, i ocated on the edge of the valley at he beginning of the Siskiyou range, place close to Medford; must be a hargain and immediate possession. de and pear orchards are in the viminity of the city, as a peach-grow g section it is the largest in the disriet. The foothills around Ashland re all in peach orchards and the nnual shipments of peaches from his city run into the thousands.

Jacksonville, the county seat of ackson county, is four miles west of Medford at the beginning of the foothills. Fine aple, pear and peach and adjoins the town, and the footnills are the very best for growing ill kinds of European grapes.

Whatever may have been said of sephine county as a grape-growing district can in truth be said of Jackon county. Jackson and Josephine ounties are both in the Rogue River valley: climate and soil conditions re identical. The winters are mild; snow rarely falls in the valley. It is an 'unusual winter' that the therometer goes as low as 18 degrees above zero. The orchardist and the farmer does his plowing, planting and eding in the Rogue River valley luring the winter months; rarely loes freezing weather occur. The Rogne River valley is rightly called the "Italy of America."
