STRANGE BLIGHT ON HUME ESTATE

Properties Fall to Pay and Heirs
Will Sell to the Highest
Bidders.

GOLD BEACH Or., May 7.—The vast estate of the deceased salmon king of the southwestern Oregon, R. D. Hume will soon be aliened and parceled out to strangers. Since his hand has ceased to direct the varied properties that comprise the greater portion of Curry county's wealth, the stream of gold that daily poured into the Hume coffers has shrunk appallingly. The Rogue river salmon industry is virtually abandoned; the Hume schooners that formerly plied between this port and San Francisco and Portland are making only occasional trips; Wedderburn the town that Hume created, is practically deserted.

Following a meeting of the heirs the announcement is made that the cannery and cold storage will be sold to the highest bidder. The fishing rights along the Rogue river will also be disposed of. No attempt has been made to carry on salmon fishing this season. The stores at Wedderburn and Gold Beach have been offered for sale, as has also the news paper at the former place.

Thousands of acres of timber and rich agriculture land will shortly be placed on the market. It is stated that the latter will be platted into tracts and sold to farmers. This action will result in a heavy increase in the county's population.

THREE BROTHERS ARE BEHIND THE BARS

PENDLETON, Or., May 7.—Like Parr, the fourth of the bootleggers to be sent to jail during the past few days as a result of a crusade being made here by Chief of Police Guerdane, was sentenced this morning. All three of the Parr brothers are now in jail. Frank Parr is serving time for a similar offense and the third brother is serving a penitentiary sentence for assisting in a robbery.

Rufus Fletcher, colored, was sentenced to 12 days in jail yesterday, because all Indians looked alike to him. Fletcher had evidently been sent on a still mission, for he rushed into a restaurant and placed a bottle of forbidden fire water and some change before Maude Moore, a square and graduate of Carlisle.

The latter's evidence, by which Fletcher was convicted of bootlegging, proved that he had mistaken the patron's identity.
