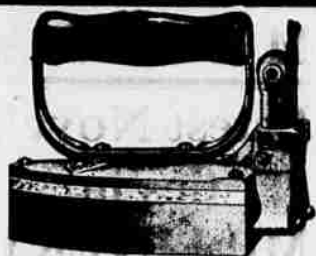

SHOW WAS CLEAN RAPID AND CLEVER

Sells-Floto Lived Up to Their Promises—Thousands Spent Money Freely With the Show.

Thousands introduced themselves to the ticket sellers for the Sells-Floto circus Monday, so many thousands that hundreds had a hard time to see the performances. Not only was every seat taken, but squads stood at the entrance, a standing joke for the clowns. Society went, thought it was slumming, and became more enthusiastic and appreciative than anyone. Those who posed for being blasé ripped a throat seam laughing at the bicycle clown. Another package of giggles was unwrapped when a terrier dog trotted along in the masquerade of a pony, an epitome of a colt.

"Don't you love to sit here and watch the crowds come?" exclaimed a society matron with a preference for décolleté dresses, as she munched her peanuts. A "bud" was with her.

"Watch that clown and that woman," screamed the "bud," as a preposterous clown in hoop skirt, riding a bicycle, came up to a heavyweight matron who took his arm haughtily and promenaded the length of the tent to her seat. This voluminous merry-maker showered hysteria on some bashful girls who came unescorted. They screamed and fled without care for appearance, grace or dignity.

When a nature-faking clown came along the ring with a pug tied to a huge cable, Madam Society grew boisterous, then suddenly sober and pale. The "bud" immediately busied herself with an auxiliary of pins about the madame's waistband.

Nothing Dragged.

For two hours and thirty minutes exclamations and laughter struggled to see which should dive off the tongue first. None of the clowns and few of the performers encroached on any originality in their acting, but the performance was clean, the costumes bright, and the pace lively. Nothing dragged.

One of the most attractive acts was the appearance of the famous Armour six-horse team, a magnificent collection of animals. The ponderous wheel horses and the dashing leaders thrilled the hearts of everyone who likes a horse. Wales, the whip, gave an exhibition of driving that was marvelous in the smoothness and cleverness of execution. He cut the figure eight in a surprisingly small space.

"Why don't they let those horses out of the ring and have the clowns come on?" commented the matron again.

The team is valued at \$25,000, and is one of the most beautifully matched in the world.

"Ma, can I drive our turkey?" yelled a small boy as he spied a clown driving a laboring biped around the ring.

Some of the Features.

The two rings of the circus held practically duplicate performances. The usual riding, drill and athletic work of the equestrians was entertaining. The horses were unusually sleek and spirited, adding greatly to the performance. The contortionists deceived nature by collapsing into a thousand attitudes, the aerialists tumbled high and the clowns made merry in their grotesque way.

A bit of tragedy is connected with the teeth-clinging act, as in one ring new girls perform. One of a former pair lies in a San Francisco hospital, writhing with pain, the result of a 40-foot slip last week while in mid-air suspended by her teeth alone. Tragedy is ever alert and will creep in. Last evening one of the trapeze performers was badly bruised by a 20-foot fall. He was able to continue with the circus, however.

Particularly appealing was the performance of a family of acrobats including three generations. During the act, one little girl stubbed her toe. Childish tears did break forth, and a baby form was shaken with sobs.

The spiciness injected into the Sells-Floto show is a relief and pleasure. Dull moments are few.

The menagerie is very ordinary, the pride of the collection being a sacred ox of Zebu. A taur attracted some
