ORDINANCE NO. 196.

An ordinance providing for the appropriation of a rectangular strip of land, two hundred feet in length and sixty feet in width, situated in Jackson county, Oregon, the center line of which is described as follows: Commencing on the southerly line of West Eleventh street, in the city of Medford, 356 feet westerly from the west line of Oakdale avenue and extending thence southerly parallel with the west line of Oakdale avenue two hundred feet for the purpose of laying out thereon a public street and highway of said city, and authorizing the mayor and recorder to enter into a contract with the owner of said land for the purchase of the same for said purpose on the terms herein set forth, and in the event that said owner refuses to enter into such contract, directing the institution of an action for the condemnation of said premises.

The city of Medford doth ordain as follows:

Section 1. It is hereby declared both convenient and necessary that the city of Medford acquire by purchase or condemnation for the purpose of laying out thereon a public street and highway of and in said city the following described strip or parcel of land: A rectangular piece of land, 60 feet in width and 200 feet in length, the center line of which is described as follows: Commencing on the south line of West Eleventh street, 356 feet westerly from the west line of Oakdale avenue, and running thence south, parallel with said west line of Oakdale avenue 200 feet, said strip or parcel of land being also described as follows: Commencing 330 feet east of the north-west corner of lot one, block one, Barr's addition to the city of Medford, Jackson county, Oregon; from said point running thence east 80 feet; thence south 200 feet; thence west 60 feet; thence north 200 feet to the place of beginning.

Section 2. The mayor and recorder are hereby authorized and directed to enter into a contract with P. J. Halley, the person in possession of and the owner of said strip of land, for the purchase thereof for said purpose, for the sum of one thousand four hundred and fifty dollars, and the mayor is hereby directed to immediately offer said Halley on behalf of the said city said amount for said premises for said purpose. Said

agreement, if entered into, shall provide for the payment of said amount by said city in cash immediately upon said Halley's tendering a deed to said premises for said purpose, conveying perfect title thereto for said purpose. Or, if said Halley shall prefer, said mayor and recorder are hereby authorized and directed, without any preliminary contract, to draw a warrant on the city treasurer for said amount upon the tender of such deed by said Halley, and said mayor is hereby authorized and directed to offer so to do.

Section 3. In the event that said offer is not accepted within three days after the making thereof as above provided, the city attorney is hereby directed to institute on behalf of said city an action for the condemnation and appropriation of said land, in accordance with the charter of said city.

Section 3. Said street is hereby declared to be necessary to the immediate peace, health and safety of said city, and inasmuch as said Halley is engaged in constructing a dwelling house on said parcel of land, and is at the present time expending considerable amounts of money for labor and material thereon, which will be of little value when said parcel of land is devoted to street purposes, and the cost of said parcel of land is rapidly increasing by reason of the foregoing stated facts, so that there is danger that the price will become greater than the city can afford to pay therefor, and the opening up of said street rendered impracticable, therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance by reason of the foregoing emergency shall become immediately operative when passed by the council and approved by the mayor in accordance

with the charter and ordinances of said city relating thereto.

The foregoing ordinance was passed by the council on May 21st, 1909, on the following vote: Merrick aye, Welch aye, Wortman aye, Eifert aye, Demmer aye, Emerick absent.
