Presbyterians Expect Big Time in Portland.

Portland Presbyterians are putting their best foot forward in their effort to get ready for the Brotherhood convention, June 8 and 9. The Portland Commercial Club has been secured for the opening event, which will be a banquet, or fellowship supper. Mr. Robert Livingston, one of the well-known citizens of the state, will preside. It is expected that W. W. Cotton, general attorney of the Harriman lines in Oregon will give an address of welcome. Wallace McCamant, of the Portland bar, will speak upon "The Appeal of Historic Presbyterianism to the Men of Today." The moderator of the General Assembly will probably be present and will respond to the sentiment, "The Presbyterian Church of Today." President Charles S. Holt, of Chicago will speak on the "Presbyterian Brotherhood."

The convention theme will be the claim of the church upon its men. "The Man and His Master," "The Man and His Minister," "The Man and His Family Altar," "The Man and the Bible School," "The Man and the Boy," "The Man and his Community," "The Man and Education," "The Man and Missions," "The Man and Personal Evangelism," will be presented by some of the leading Presbyterians of the state. Among the speakers are: A. C. Schmitt, of Albany; J. F. Ewing, E. C. Herlow, Judge E. C. Bronaugh, Dr. J. R. Wilson, Jesse J. Ross, all of Portland; R. B. Morton, of Pendleton, and W. P. Cragin, of McMinnville. A round table conference and open parliament will be conducted by the national officers. Wednesday evening the popular mass meeting will be addressed by Dr. Landrith and President Holt, and Dr. Foulkes, of Portland, the latter speaks upon the theme, "The Pacific Presbyterian Brotherhood."

Letters are being received by laymen all over the state, asking them whether brothers or brothers-in-law of the church, to plan to take in this convention. The newspapers all over the state have very generous mention of the gathering, and posters containing the likeness of the national officers have been sent all over the state.

CITY NOTICES.

ORDINANCE NO. 197.

An ordinance providing for the acquiring by purchase or condemnation by the city of Medford, Oregon, for the purpose of providing water for the use of the inhabitants of the city of Medford, of certain real property particularly described therein; providing for making a tender and offer to M. F. Hanley, the owner of said real property and in possession thereof, of two thousand dollars for a good and sufficient deed, conveying good title to said real property to the said city of Medford, and providing for the condemnation of said real property in case said offer and tender is not accepted.

The city of Medford doth ordain as follows:

Section 1. It is convenient and necessary that the following described real property be acquired by purchase or condemnation, in order to provide water for the use of the inhabitants of said city, and particularly for the purpose of laying thereon a pipeline in which to conduct water from the city's source of water supply to said city.

Section 2. The following is a description of the property so necessary to be acquired: An easement and right of way for laying under the surface of the ground a pipeline and for ingress thereto and egress therefrom on and over the following described land: A strip of land 11,244 feet long and 30 feet wide, the center line of which is described as follows: Beginning at a point on the east boundary line of section 25, township 36 south, range 2 east of Willamette meridian, 952.9 feet north of the southwest corner of said section; thence by the following bearings and distances, as staked out and marked from said point, being Station 2, 64.1 to the boundary fence between Hanley and Dick Slinger, being station 115, 08.1, a total dis-

Said pipeline to be laid beneath the surface of the ground and the ditch in which it is laid to be properly backfilled and tamped and the surface of the ground of said tract to be restored and maintained at its present level.

Section 3. The mayor and recorder are hereby authorized to draw a warrant on the city treasurer, payable to the mayor on the gravity water fund for the sum of two thousand dollars, and said mayor is hereby directed to procure in legal tender money on said warrant the sum of two thousand dollars and to offer and tender the same to M. F. Hanley, the owner of said land, for a good and sufficient deed conveying a good title to said easement and right of way, said offer and tender to be made on behalf of the city of Medford.

Section 4. It is the opinion of the council that said amount of two thousand dollars is the highest

amount the city of Medford would be warranted in paying for said easement and right of way and that if said offer and tender is refused or if said Hanley does not announce his intention of accepting the same within three days after said offer and tender is made and in view of the fact that said Hanley has refused to place any price a said easement and right of way, it is the opinion of the council that it is impossible to agree with said Hanley as to the compensation therefor, and the mayor of said city is hereby directed and instructed to return said sum of two thousand dollars to the treasurer of said city and the city attorney is hereby directed, in the event above mentioned, to forthwith institute on behalf of the city in action for the appropriation and condemnation of said easement and right of way. In the event, however, that said Hanley shall accept said offer and tender, the said mayor is directed and instructed, on behalf of the city to pay over to said Hanley said amount of two thousand dollars upon his delivering to the city a good and sufficient deed conveying good title to said easement.

Section 5. It is hereby declared to be necessary for the immediate peace, health and safety of said city and its inhabitants that said easement and right of way be forthwith acquired in order that through the pipeline to be laid by virtue thereof a supply of pure water be at once obtained for said city and its inhabitants and the danger of sickness and epidemics from want of a supply of pure water in said city be prevented. For the foregoing reasons, and because there is at present no adequate supply of pure water available to the said city and its inhabitants, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this ordinance

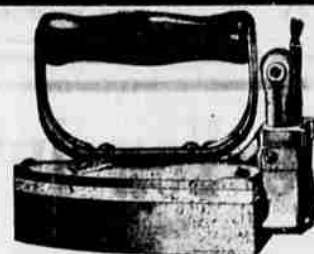
