OREGON CITY, Ore., June 8.—Villa Brown, the fourth victim of the murderous crime of Bert B. Garrett, at Marquam, died Sunday after a day and a night of agony. The girl was 16 years of age and was a daughter of Mrs. Garrett by her first husband. Her injuries were known to be fatal from the first.

The funeral of Garrett, who blew himself and three other members of his family into eternity with dynamite last week, took place Sunday evening. The bodies were sent to Hardman, Eastern Oregon, for burial, as Mrs. Garrett's first husband is buried there. This is in accordance with the woman's dying wish.

### CRATER LAKE ROAD IS NOW ASSURED

#### PROMINENT ATTORNEYS RENDER OPINION

Government Engineer on the Ground and is Delighted with the Prospect for Wonderful Highway.

The action of Attorney McMahon of Salem in attempting to nullify the state appropriation for the Crater Lake road is causing widespread comment all over the state and has raised a most interesting legal question among the members of the legal fraternity throughout the state. So far as the supreme court of Oregon is concerned, it has handed down but one opinion on the subject of appropriations for highways, and that in the case of J. W. Maxwell vs. Tillamook county, in which the court

held the act to be a special and local law within the meaning of the constitution. At first glance the opinion seems to favor the contention of McMahon, but a comparison of the Tillamook wagon road appropriation and the Crater Lake appropriation would indicate that the framers of the latter had in view all of the objections raised by the supreme court to the former act and had successfully evaded them.

Many prominent attorneys throughout the state have volunteered their services gratis in defense of the appropriation and the consensus of opinion is that McMahon's cheap political ruse will receive its final knockout in the preliminaries of the Marion county court.
