Efforts of A. S. Bliton to secure the city printing at Tuesday night's session of the council met defeat, when the report of the finance committee recommending no change in present arrangement was adopted by vote of 3 to 1, Welch, Emerick and Eifert voting aye, and Merrick no. It developed during the discus-

sion that the city was paying the same price as paid Mr. Bliton last year and Mr. Bliton admitted that when he had the printing he consid-ered it a fair price. The report of the committee read as follows:

"We, the finance committee, beg leave to file herewith our report in reply to the enclosed letter of Mr. A. S. Bliton in regard to the city printing.

"On January 19 at our regular meeting the following motion was passed, of which the following is an exact copy: "Moved by Eifert and seconded

by Demmer that the Medford Daily Tribune be made the official paper of the city for the ensuing year at the same price for printing, etc., formerly charged, and that all the city officers be instructed to place all the city printing, etc., with said paper.' On roll call the vote was as follows: Welch, Emerick, Eifert and Demmer voted aye: Wortman and Merrick voted no. Motion carried and so ordered

"We, the finance committee, therefore see no reason why any change should be made at this time, providing the above is fully complied with. "E. A. WELCH. " V. J. EMERICK."
