CALIFORNIA CROP IS ENCOURAGING

Distributors Issue Bulletin Declaring Conditions Are Very Favorable.

The California Fruit Distributors just issued a bulletin giving the number of cars of delicious fruit shipped to all points by members the company for the week ending June 14. The bulletin also contains an interesting and valuable information and is as follows: Grapes—52 cars — Alexander grapes are now meeting their class, other varieties, such as Hale's Triumph, will immediately follow. There will be a steady increase in the shipment, and we expect that between 50 and 60 carloads will go this week. Conditions remain the same as our last report. Bartlett's are going up nicely, and are clean and

in every way desirable. The earlier varieties are being shipped more freely, but there is not enough of them to cut any figures in any way.

Grapes—Grapes have in no way changed their promise for a fine crop during the last week. All conditions remain favorable, and the quality of the fruit is now promising to be exceedingly good.

There has been no change in the weather since the 8th inst., except possibly it is not quite so warm. It is in every way favorable, and we could not ask for conditions to be more desirable. We are having a splendid demand throughout the western territory for C. O. B. cars, and are in a better position to give desirable assortments this year than ever before. We have every reason to believe that the carrying qualities of our fruit this season will be exceptionally good.
