### JUDGE SAYS BILL IS LOCAL.

(Continued from Page 1.)

### Reames' Statement.

Clarence L. Reames, who defended the bill, thus interprets the decision: "The decision of Judge Galloway will, of course, should the decision become final, defeat the appropriation. The decree of the circuit court of Marion county will, following the decision, enjoin and restrain the secretary of state from issuing any warrants whatever upon the orders of the commission, and will enjoin and restrain the state treasurer from paying out any money whatever either to the Crater Lake land commission or upon its order. This injunction order will be perpetual and its effect can only be averted by an appeal to the supreme court."

Should Appeal.

"On a question of this great magnitude an appeal should be taken to the supreme court so that the question may now be settled and determined once and forever. Steps should be taken at once by public spirited citizens to raise the money for war for the appeal. I have the promise of W. D. Fenton that when the case is brought to the supreme court on appeal that he will do everything in his power to assist us in the trial; this he will do without any compensation whatever. Our firm is willing to do what we can to aid the cause and to see that the record is sent up to the appellate court, and the appeal perfected so that the issues may be squarely presented for review. For this and the assistance we can render we would not expect compensation."

### Court Expenses.

"But the actual court expenses on the appeal will probably reach \$200 and they might go over this. In addition an appeal bond must be filed, conditioned that the bondsmen will pay the costs of the plaintiff on appeal should the plaintiff prevail in the higher court. The penalty on this bond will be in about the sum of \$100, and this bond shall be furnished at once."
