MUCH FREIGHT KLAMATH FALLS

First Month's Business Shows Average of Over \$2000 a Day. Constantly Increasing.

KLAMATH FALLS, June 28.—Over two thousand dollars a day is a pretty good record for freight business for the first month's business of the railroad in Klamath Falls. The railroad began business in this city on May 20th, and it is estimated that the total receipts from the handling of freight for the first month is \$65,000, or more than \$2,000 a day. In addition to this, the passenger business will run from \$8000 to \$12,000 a month, which will bring the monthly total up to \$75,000.

This is not so bad for the first month, and the indications are that the traffic will greatly increase as the summer advances. Nearly all of this business was done with the merchants of Klamath Falls, and it is a striking illustration of the enormous amount of trade handled by the business men of this city. It is expected that all of the freight for Lakeview will soon be shipped via Klamath Falls, and this will greatly increase the monthly receipts of the railroad at this point.

A record for the first month such as Klamath Falls can show will probably open the eyes of the Portland and San Francisco jobbers, and bring them to a realization of what they are overlooking in the way of business.

SENATOR FRYE SHOULD BE ASKED TO VISIT THE ROGUE

WASHINGTON, June 28.—Senator William P. Frye, of Maine, sage of the Senate, is missing a fishing trip this summer for the first time in 30 years. Late in the spring he gets a call that comes to him from the crystal waves of the Rangley lakes and the breeze that sings in the Pine woods. The lakes are in northwestern Maine and are celebrated as fishing grounds and for the attractions they offer to tourists. Mr. Frye has a fishing camp up there and with friends he has responded to the call regularly for a generation.

Commencing at a point on the present boundary line of the city of Medford, in section nineteen (19), township thirty-seven (37), range one (1) west of Willamette meridian, in Jackson county, Oregon, due west from the northwest corner of Sunrise Home Park addition, in said section, as laid in the plat thereof, on file in the office of the recorder of conveyances in said county; thence east one thousand four hundred and fifty (1450) feet, more or less, to said northwest corner of said Sunrise Home Park addition; thence east on the north line of said addition eight hundred and fifty-three (853) feet to the east line of donation claim No. forty-two (42); thence south on the east line of said donation claim No. 42 five hundred forty-seven and sixteen-hundredths (547.16) feet to the north line of Queen Anne addition to the city of Medford; the same being the section line between sections nineteen (19) and thirty (30) of said township and range; thence east on said section line two thousand two hundred and fifty-three (2253) feet to the north-

Resolved further, that notice of all matters herein set forth be given by publishing this resolution for four weeks prior to said election in The Medford Daily Tribune, a newspaper of general circulation in said city of Medford, and in the territory above described, and also by posting four copies of this resolution in four public places in said city and in four public places in the territory above described for four weeks prior to said election.
