### GOLD HILL MAN CLAIMS CHAMPION CHERRY TREE

Gold Hill News.  
George Lyman of Gold Hill has a Royal Anne cherry tree which he claims is the biggest and best tree

in Oregon south of the Willamette, where they have trees 20 years older than the one on his place.

The tree was planted 34 years ago and for over 30 years has been in bearing. There have been some wonderful crops of cherries picked from

the tree, but no accurate account has ever been kept. This year cherries to the amount of nearly 200 gallons have been accounted for and there are still many gallons on the tree, which, owing to its size and spread of the limbs, are inaccessible.
