**TYPHOID ON BATTLESHIPS
CAUSED BY BAD POTATOES**

PROVINCETOWN, Mass., Aug. 4.—That the outbreak of typhoid fever among the men of the battleship fleet was due to bad potatoes was the official verdict of a naval physician on the supply ship Celtie today, after a thorough investigation. The ice cream and various other things on the ship's bill of fare have been under suspicion, but it is now believed that potatoes were the cause of the trouble. As a result of the examination of the hundreds of barrels about 60 per cent have been condemned, and today the vessel steamed out to sea and dumped them overboard.
