The City of Medford doth ordain as follows:

Section 1. It is the intention of the council to cause a six-inch lateral sewer to be constructed along Orange street between Eighth and Tenth streets and to assess the cost thereof upon the property adjacent to said portion of said street in proportion to its frontage thereon.

Section 2. 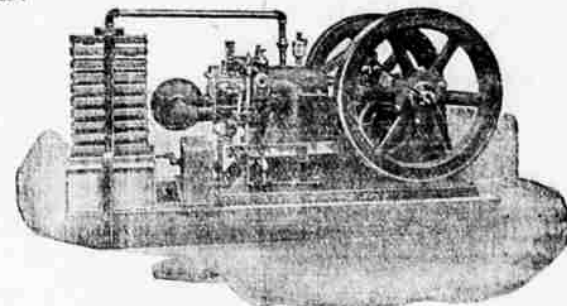
