ASHLAND BUYS LAND TO PROTECT WATER SUPPLY

ASHLAND, August 11.—The city of Ashland has closed a deal for the purchase from L. H. and E. J. Teeters of certain holdings of land along Ashland creek at and above the lower intake of the city water system, amounting to 30 1/2 acres. The Teeters habitation just below the water intake of the lower system, and familiar to travelers through the canyon, is on a one-quarter acre tract embraced in the purchase, and there are two other separate tracts further up the canyon, one of 20 acres and one of 10 1/4 acres, which have now become the property of the city, acquired as a means of further protecting the water supply and the pipelines and the prevention of any possible contamination of the stream, which is the source of Ashland's splendid water supply. The consideration of the purchase in the present instance was \$900.

NEW RURAL ROUTE TO RUN OUT OF ASHLAND

ASHLAND, Or., August 11.—Postmaster Casey has been notified by the department that a new free delivery rural mail route will be established from the Ashland postoffice as soon as the patrons of the service shall have agreed to maintain the boxes requisite for it. The route is part within the corporation limits of Ashland outside the present free delivery district, and extends to Soda Springs, 10 miles east of Ashland, including also the Neil creek mill district and the Barron postoffice. The total distance as outlined by the following description of the district made up by the department is 25 1/2 miles, but this will probably be added to so as to include a small but populous territory in Ashland that for some reason seems to have been overlooked in making up the route, in the Weightman street vicinity.
