3,000,000 ACRES IN HARNEY STILL WAITING FOR SETTLERS

BURNS, Or., Aug. 13.—Notwithstanding heavy immigration and settlement the past few years, there are yet in Harney county over 3,000,000 acres of government land subject to entry, including timber, grazing, mineral and agricultural land, a greater area than the entire state of New Jersey, and two thirds the area of the whole of Massachusetts.

Up to a short time ago this vast domain was devoted entirely to stock raising, immense herds of cattle, sheep and horses feeding over the illimitable ranges during the greater part of the year, while large quantities of hay have been cut for their winter use.

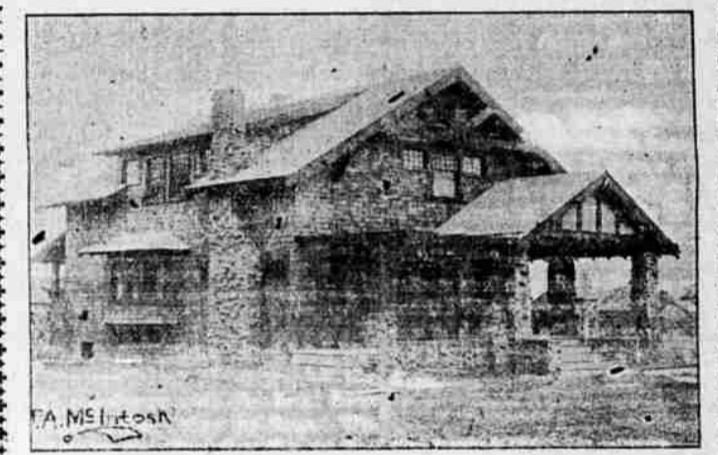
