

# HERE'S A CHANCE FOR MEDFORD CHILDREN

### Conservation Commission to Have School Children Write on Resources.

Oregon resources are to be the subject for competitive articles written by the school children of the state. Prizes will be awarded for the best treatise, and arrangements will be made to have the winning articles given the broadest possible publicity. Chairman J. N. Teal of the conservation commission, which is the official body of the state looking to conservation of resources, has decided to offer prizes for such articles.

Full details have not been worked out, as the departure is just being given serious thought. As soon as Mr. Teal can arrange with the conservation committee to have proper announcements made, so that the matter will go before all of the school children of the state, the exact prizes will be named, and the conditions under which the offer is made will be published.

Forests will be the main idea of the work. Thoughtful men and especially the members of the conservation commission and the Conservation association, are impressed with the tremendous wealth contained in Oregon's forests, and the necessity of having the state realize its asset and so organize policies that the greatest and most permanent results may be achieved in handling forests. The children will be urged to the most careful study of forests of Oregon, forest uses, conservation and protection from fire. By enlisting their study, the attention of their elders will be directed to the same thought. This is the ultimate end of the conservation workers. No campaign is being waged to attract the attention of the outside investor, for he as a rule is fully informed on the latent wealth of this state. All efforts will be directed to the citizen of Oregon, who is necessarily steward of local resources, with the hope of impressing him with the immensity of his charge, and the results assured when resources are intelligently husbanded.

## WIZARD NOT TO BE OUT THIS YEAR

### Holabird Returns From East and Denies Report That Harriman Is Coming.

KLAMATH FALLS, Aug. 25.—W. H. Holabird returned recently from New York City where he has been on private business. He left for Pelican Bay this afternoon, where he will continue to carry out his plans for improvement started prior to his departure for the eastern metropolis. Asked relative to the report that Mr. Harriman would be here this year, he said: "I have no information whatever from Mr. Harriman that would cause me to change the statement that I made some time since to the effect that Mr. Harriman would not be in Klamath Falls this year. No preparations have been made for his coming."

When the question that is uppermost in the minds of the people of the state—the building of the Deschutes road—was touched, the Colonel was interested at once. He was told that the announcement was made that the Hill line if constructed, would not come through Klamath Falls. "I have traveled over practically every road and trail in Eastern Oregon," said he, "and I want to say that Klamath County is the choice of

them all, with her timber, water and agricultural resources.

### ROSEBURG CLAIMS NOW POPULATION OF 5323

ROSEBURG, Or., Aug. 25.—A gain of almost 215 per cent. in population in the past nine years is the record made by the city of Roseburg, according to the compilation of the new city directory by Fred S. Bynon. The government census for the year 1900 gave Roseburg a population of 1690. Mr. Bynon's figures show a population at the present day of 5323. The increase is materially due to the extension of the city boundaries three years ago, although a large number of homeseekers from the East have settled here during the past few years.
