The racing program for the state fair, which opens for the week beginning Monday, September 13, issued by Secretary Frank A. Welch, of the state fair board, contains many new and attractive features over the program of previous years and, judging by the entries in the early closing stakes, the talent represented in the harness events will surpass that of any previous meeting held on Lone Oak track.

One of the new features introduced is the offering of three stakes for runners, with an aggregate of \$1000 Griffith. in premiums. Heretofore it has been the rule to arrange the running TWO TIMBER CLAIMS events by over-night entries, and no entrfance fee was charged. The only revenue obtained by the fair management under that system was a small percentage of the earnings of running stake races will have to enas apply to the harness events.
