LINN COUNTY FAIR SUCCESS

Largest Attendance in History of the Organization—Big Success.

ALBANY, Or., Sept. 4.—The Linn county fair at Seio has closed, the attendance during the three days was the largest in the history of the organization. The exhibits of grains, grasses, fruits, vegetables and blooded stock were better than were ever seen in this country.

The racing program was the main attraction. Yesterday Falmont Jr., owned by Fred Woodcock, won the 2:26 trotting race with Dollie Dimple second. Lew Miller, a Portland horse, won the 2:15 pacing event. The three-fourths mile went to Tarranta, owned by F. Price, with Counselor, a horse well known in Albany, second.

Fred Spires of this city won nearly all the first honors with his Pereheron horses. Charles Barrows made a clean sweep for first places with his Poland China pigs. John Kirkland of Albany won the trotting race Monday with Lady Malcolm.

The Oregon state fair has decided to let the Albany Commercial club have the famous Linn county front after the close of the fair. The front is made up of 38 kinds of Linn county wood and will be used as an exhibit in the club rooms. It has been at Salem as a Linn county exhibit since the Lewis and Clark exposition.

Horses at Eugene.

EUGENE, Or., Sept. 4.—There promises to be a big string of race horses at the district fair, which will be held in Eugene, beginning September 8 and continuing four days. Report comes from Seio, where the Linn county fair has just closed, that 50 or 60 horses will be brought to Eugene.

The fair committee is making extensive preparations for entertaining a big crowd here. The fair has been extensively advertised and people from all parts of this district, which includes Lane, Douglas, Coos and Curry counties, besides many from outside points, are expected to be here.

WOULD PROSPECT FOR OIL IN COOS COUNTY

MARSHFIELD, Or., Sept. 4.—J. W. Perkins of oil fame has been in this city looking over the possibilities of boring for oil. He states that he is negotiating with the C. A. Smith company with a view of boring on their property, but that securing leases in the county is slow work. There promises to be boring done here before long, as several persons are looking into the matter.
