He was in town recently and showed us samples of rock from his new discovery which contains free gold and pans from 5 to 25 cents to a pan. The vein is four feet and of a greyish porphyry or, and the claim is located about half a mile west of the Buckeye group. While in town Mr. Ramsey had some of the rock assayed by assayer Johnson and his return showed 8 ounces of piatlunm to the ton valued at \$166.60. Mr. Ramsey is having other assays made at Denver and other cities, so will soon know what the rock fully contains.
