Raining all the morning. Very fair attendance at sale.

Grape market a little stronger. Our Florin car averaging \$173. Exchange had two cars averaging \$137 and \$150. Lodi Tokays averaged \$1.33. Winters \$1.44. Our general average \$1.51. Malagas still continued in liberal receipt, many showing waste; our average 90c.

Bartlett's from Placerville and Winters, hard ripe to ripe, \$2.30. 750 peaches from Placerville averaged \$1.34; Gros prunes from the same district \$1.80; Silvers from Holister, \$1.12; few Kelseys, \$1.25.

Liberal supplies of Italians; stock selling mostly 90c to \$1.10; our average 96c. Hungarians sold much better; our average \$1.65.

Expect a better market here on Monday for grapes, as Wednesday marks the beginning of the Jewish holidays.

WASHINGTON, Sept. 14.—George W. Fishback, formerly American secretary of legation at Buenos Ayres, has been appointed a special commissioner by the directorate of the Argentine Agricultural exposition to create interest in that enterprise. An effort is to be made to secure an appropriation of \$25,000 by congress to transport the agricultural exhibits now at Seattle to Buenos Ayres.
