

# 1000 BOXES OF NEWTOWN TO ACRE

Ad Helms' Orchard of Newtowns Is  
Making an Excellent  
Showing.

The Ad Helms orchard at the south end of the Rogue River valley is again forging to the front as a record breaker, says the Herald. This orchard consists of eight acres of 23-year-old Newtown Pippins, and the trees are now laden with the biggest crop on record, an estimated yield of 1000 boxes to the acre. From present indications this will net the owner from \$1500 to \$2000 an acre.

In 1907 the orchard produced 6500 boxes of Newtowns, which netted the owner \$2.50 a box, or \$16,000.

### WEYERHAEUSER MAY BUY CONTROL OF WEED COMPANY

KLAMATH FALLS, Sept. 17.—It is announced here that the Weyerhaeuser Timber company will take over the controlling interest in the Weed Lumber company. The Long-Bell Lumber company at the present time holds the largest interest in the Weed company, and if satisfactory arrangements are made, the Weyerhaeuser people will likely get the controlling interest. There is a tract of about 40,000 acres of uncut timber in this holding, also the large manufacturing plant now located at Weed. It is stated that the Weyerhaeuser company has some understanding with J. J. Hill as to the latter's intentions with regard to building a line into this country.

### HOMESEEKERS COMING IN LARGE NUMBERS

HERMISTON, Or., Sept. 17.—Forty people from North Dakota, coming in a special car, will be here about next Monday to look over the lands owned by the successors of the Maxwell Land company here. These people are looking for homes, and it is expected they will buy here. Agent of the land company, now in the middle west, report that many of the people there are looking toward Oregon and that within the next six months thousands of well-to-do farmers will come to this state to find homes in the unsettled portions of Oregon.
