SURVEYORS WORK SOUTH OF BEND

Camp Headquarters Removed Fifteen Miles Upstream Saturday.

BEND, Or., Sept. 21,-The Hill surveying eamp, which has been foented at Bend for about a mouth, Saturday moved 15 miles up the Deachutes to resume work at that point. Motor leaves The erew has been engaged in locating the preliminary sudreey for the Oregon Trunk line from Rend up the east, bank of the river and across the lava heds abatting the Deschutes nine miles from town. This preliminary line has now been earried neross the lava fields and the surveyors moved to the south side. Just how far the survey will be made southward is not known, but it is generally believed that Klamath Falls. is the present objective. At all No. 4 Leaves Eagle Pt. . . | 4:15 p. m. events another surveying erew went through to Odell some weeks ago, who are conducting the survey from that vicinity northward to connect with the one under way from Bend A third crew, which recently camp-

ed at Bend, is filling up the missing link between Redmond, the mossoutherly point of the central Ore gon survey, and Bend. Once this is completed and the other two erew have joined forces near Odell, a line of prospective road will extend from the Columbia river southward for more than 200 miles. Thus for no terminals have been announced.

During the past week many rumors and reports were brought to Bend by those who have crossed the Caseades, relative to work now in progress on the Corvallis & Eastern line. It is maintained, and apparently upon good authority, that sev eral miles of the old grade east from Detroit have been cleared of under brush ready for rail laying, and that a party of surveyors are at work near the summit of the mountains.
