MEDFORD PEARS ALWAYS LEAD

Sgobel & Day, under date of September 18, say:

Pears—California Bartletts about finished and the finest arriving certainly are those from Medford.

Best Bartletts are higher and season nearly finished. We sold our second car half Comice Thursday morning, making an average of \$3.18, an immense price. These two cars Comice that we sold this week made grosses of \$3230 and \$3183 but the pears were beautiful, with high blush. We expect to make high prices on our Comice coming from Medford. Shortly our d'Anjous will arrive, and should do well.

Prunes—Hungarians in very light supply and badly wanted. Italians strong, if sound, but three cars past few days have been quite soft. Light arrivals of Italians expected and a good market ahead of us on sound prunes. Let them come to New York. Everybody asking for the Idaho prunes, which are expected to be very firm.

Peaches—We must confess to disappointment, because even with very small arrivals the market is not strong. None coming from California, and the Colorado Elbertas are selling from \$1.05 to 90c, entirely owing to the immense receipts of about 50 cars a day from western New York, bulk of low grade, but many are very good and selling low. We doubt if Colorado peaches do well here for a while.

Weather has been very warm through the week, but today Saturday, it is superb. Our great Hudson-Fulton celebration for two weeks from next Saturday, it is estimated, will bring several millions of visitors and consumption of fruit will be enormous.
