

WILD WEST IS TRUE HOME OF LUXURIES

Farmers Out of Debt and Are Investing in Autos and the Like.

TOPEKA, Kan., Sept. 29.—Chancellor Strong of the University of Kansas is quoted as saying that so much money has been made in the west during the last ten years, and so much of it has been given to the boy, presumably the farmer's son, "that he has desired to live pretty well, and some of them (the boys) have craved and have had motor cars. All of this," adds the chancellor, "has a tendency to distract attention from studies, and we have had some hard work to combat the tendency." Now, as to the western boy's father. Secretary Wilson, on his return the other day from a month's vacation on his farm in Iowa, when asked if it were really true that farmers were investing such large sums of money in automobiles, replied: "The farmer is out of debt; he has paid for his farm, his fences and his machinery. He has money in his pockets and big crops continue to come on. He will not invest in eastern securities, lest a year might bring trouble there. As a result he puts his money in luxuries, instead of channels that might give a return. Why, folks in the east do not know what luxuries are. They must go west to find that out."

Unless the country has been greatly misinformed by the bank commissioners of Iowa and Kansas and other western states, and by many other persons who have taken up the subject at various times during the last few years, Secretary Wilson is very likely to be called upon to modify some of these statements.

FASTEST AEROPLANE IS ALSO THE SMALLEST

NEW YORK, Sept. 29.—The fastest aeroplane that has yet been devised is also the smallest. It has only nine square yards of surface, or about one-sixth the surface of a Wright machine. 'FRISCO HAS GREAT INCREASE IN VOTES

SAN FRANCISCO, Sept. 29.—Registration for the coming municipal election, to be held in November, ended at midnight. When the registration books were closed a total of 91,141 voters were enrolled. This is an increase of 17,612 over the registration of 1908.

The increase is attributed partly to the increase of population, and the return of many former residents to the reconstructed city.

JEROME WILL RUN AS INDEPENDENT CANDIDATE

NEW YORK, Sept. 29.—District Attorney Jerome will file the petitions that will give him a column on the official ballot as an independent candidate with the board of elections today. He will run independently. About 10,000 persons, anxious to see Jerome re-elected for a third term, have signed petitions for his nomination. Only 5000 are to be filed, however.

GERMAN CHURCHES WILL USE ENGLISH IN SERVICE

BURLINGTON, Ia., Sept. 29.—The German Evangelical Synod of North America, in session here yesterday, adopted a resolution permitting the language best understood by the community to be used in the young people's societies of the church.

This is believed to be the opening wedge for the introduction of English in church services now conducted entirely in German.

LETS PIPING CONTRACT FOR GRAVITY SYSTEM

FOREST GROVE, Or., Sept. 29.—The council awarded the contract last night for the nine miles of piping for the new gravity system here to the Western Water Pipe company of Portland for \$21,536. It is to be 10-inch bored wooden pipe and laid in a ditch. The company has until February 1 to complete the work.

CANADA GAINS MILLION AND QUARTER IN 10 YEARS
