MANE GRAPES IN NEW YORK

Rae & Hatfield of New York, under date of September 27, issued the following New York deciduous market letter: Good weather prevailed Saturday and Sunday, but turned to rain today. Good attendance at sale. With over 90 per cent of the offering consisting of grapes, market ruled very weak, especially on the ordinary quality. Nearly all the Lodi and District Tokays ran very small and very ordinary, prices ranging 60c to 70c. Elk Grove showed up better and averaged \$1.11. Our general average 80c. Malages were in generally good condition and also in liberal receipt. Our average 91c. Pears high today, some Bartlett's selling as high as \$5 and from that down to \$3.37 1/2. Half boxes of Comice sold from \$1.50 to \$1.87 1/2. Boxes of Winter Nelis, ordinary, \$1.87 1/2 to \$1.75. Colorado peaches higher, extra selling mostly \$1.15; fancy, \$1. Few Georgia Lates averaged 80c. Italians sold well, \$1.25 to \$1.37 1/2. Still raining this afternoon. Prospects not very bright for tomorrow's sale.

LIQUOR CASE HARD FOUGHT

Prosecution Alleges Defense Approached Chief Witness in the Case.

GRANTS PASS, Or., Oct. 4.—One of the hardest contested cases upon the charge of selling liquor in violation of the prohibition law took place Saturday, when August Fetisch was duly arraigned for trial. At the very outset the jurymen were confronted with exacting and sweeping questions that called for answers that would test their prejudice or bias for or against prohibition. Many amusing incidents occurred during the examination. The opening statement of the counsel for the state to the jury suggested that Tom Thorson, an anti-saloon detective residing at 734 Kearney street, Portland, was approached two weeks ago by the defendant and offered \$650 to stay away from Grants Pass during circuit court week. The defendant also attempted to prove an alibi by several witnesses. The courtroom was crowded with advocates and friends of both sides of the question.
