OUTPUT MINERAL WATER INCREASES

Five Commercial Establishments Now Market Output for Medic-

inal Purposes.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 5 .- The production of mineral water in Oregon is still to be listed as an infant industry, but one which brings handsome revenues for those engaged in its bottling. At prevailing rates, not a few enterprising Oregonians should be able to amass neat fortunes out of the bottling and sale of mineral water, provided they can find the necessary mineral springs.

During the past year, according to the geological survey, 25,350 gallons tral station. of Oregon mineral water were bottled and sold at an average price of 35 cents a gallon. The total output brought in \$8830. The industry, it is shown, is slowly expanding, for in the previous year was put out 1125 gallons less, and the average selling price during 1907 was only 23 cents a gallon. Water, which costs virtually nothing to produce and very little to market, must necessarily net a neat profit when sold at 35 cents a gallon. That is way above the market price of refined kerosene.

About half the Oregon mineral water marketed is used for medical purposes. Some of it is purely for table use and some is used in the manufacture of soft drinks. Only six springs in the state are being developed commercially at this time. These are located at the following points respectively: Boswell, Douglas county; Cascadia, Linn county; Colestin, Jackson county; Seneca, Grant connty; Soda Springs, Jackson county, and Hubbard, Marion county.

Over in Washington, where Oregon prices prevailed last year, the total sales amounted to 38,900 gallons. The production in that state is declining, showing a decrease of 43 per cent from 1907. The price, however, jumped from 16 to 35 cents a gallon, and the total output for 1908 sold for \$2830 mode than the larger output of the year previous.
