WRONGED POSTMASTER RIGHTE DAFTER DEATH

WASHINGTON, Oct. 7 .- The gov. ernment has finally located an heir to the estate of Postmaster George Weart, of Deal Beach, N. J., to whom the postal department owes \$10.

While Mr. Weart was postmaster at Deal Beach in 1905 a registered package valued at \$10 was reported lost, and he was forced to make good the loss. Subsequently it was discovered that the package had been delivered to the addressee.

After retiring from office Mr. Weart went west and shortly afterward died. For nearly four years the department has been searching for his heirs in order to refund the \$10.
