

SEWER AND WATER MAINS ORDERED

Council Creates New District and Orders in Many New Mains.

At a meeting of the city council on Tuesday evening sewers and water mains occupied the attention of the councilmen. An ordinance was passed creating sewer district No. 11, embracing all of that portion of the city of Medford lying east of Bear creek. The following sewers were ordered in:

A 12-inch lateral on Genesee street from East Main to Washington.

An 8-inch lateral on East Main street from Bear creek to Genesee.

A 14-inch trunk on Washington and Washington extension to Main trunk sewer at Maple and Riverside streets.

A 10-inch trunk on East Main from Roosevelt avenue to Genesee street.

An 8-inch lateral from Eighth to Elm streets to Washington street.

An 8-inch lateral along Elm street from a point 100 feet south of Main street to end of said street.

A 6-inch and 8-inch lateral along Washington from West Main street south to end of street.

An 8-inch lateral along Newtown from Eleventh to Thirteenth street and a 6-inch lateral on Twelfth from Newtown west to Peach.

A 6-inch and 8-inch lateral on West Second from Holly street west to city limits.

The following water mains were ordered in:

A 6-inch water main on Elm street from West Main street south to end of street.

A 6-inch water main on West Fourth street from Orange street to west corporation boundary.

A 4-inch water main on South Teach street from Main street to Eighth street.

A 6-inch water main on Taft avenue from west Second street to West Jackson street.

A 6-inch water main on West Washington street from Main street to south end of said street.

A 6-inch water main on Genesee street from Washington street to East Main street.

A 6-inch water main on Washington street from Howard street to Genesee street.

A 6-inch water main on Howard street from Bennett avenue to Washington street.

A 6-inch water main on Bennett avenue from Roosevelt avenue to Howard street.

A 6-inch main on Roosevelt avenue from a point 597 feet north of East Main street to Bennett avenue.
