

## LOW PRICES FOR COMICE IN EAST

Rae & Hatfield report under date of October 6:

Thirty-five cars sold here today, 20 Californias and 6 northwestern. Weather fine and pleasant. Good attendance.

Our 11 cars consisted entirely of grapes. Outside of one car of Malagas and a few Cornichons, the rest were Tokays. Market lower today. Florin averaged \$1.15 to \$1.13. Mayhews ran small, \$1.01. Lodi sold mostly 90c to \$1. Vacaville averaged 92c. Loomis 78c. Our general average 98c. Car of Malagas ran small, also showed some decay, 97c. Cornichons in same car 92c. Florin Cornichons \$1.30. Mascats averaged \$1.13.

Half boxes of Comice pears from Santa Clara sold \$2.10 to \$2.40; half boxes C. Moreau, \$1.40; boxes of Winter Nelis, \$2.75 to \$2.87 1/2; Anjou pears from Medford, \$3 to \$4.50; Washington, \$2.45 to \$3.05. Italians sold today mostly \$1.12 1/2 to \$1.25. Few 5x5 \$1.50 to \$2.

### APPLE SHOW FOLDER - ISSUED NAMING PRIZES

An attractive folder has been issued by the Northern Pacific advertising the national apple show, which will be held in Spokane November 15-20, inclusive. This exhibition has been held for a number of years and the display of the apple production of the Pacific northwest has been amazing. It is a fact not generally known that the value of this fruit crop in the Inland Empire of Oregon, Washington and Idaho for the year 1908 was \$15,000,000.

This year the capital prize of \$1500 cash for the best carload of apples will be divided into \$1000 for the first and \$500 for the second prize. Prizes for exhibits of apples on plates are offered for more than 250 varieties. Box display prizes range from \$100 cash for the first and \$50 for the second prizes to five-acre orchard tracts, which are offered as some of the first prizes. Howard Elliott, president of the Northern Pacific, has given \$1000 as a fund to augment the list and the size of the prizes.
