

ROGUE VALLEY TO BE WELL REPRESENTED

At Least Three Cars of Fancy Fruit Will Be Exhibited in Spokane.

At least three cars of fancy fruit will be shipped to the Spokane Apple show from the Rogue River valley—a car of Newtowns from A. D. Helms, a car of Spitzenberg from Tronson & Guthrie, and a car of mixed apples, Ben Davis, Spitz and Newtown from A. Conro Fiero. In addition, John G. Gore will probably send a car of Newtowns, the Bear Creek and other orchards box displays, so that this section will be adequately represented.

The Medford exhibit at the Seattle exposition will be transferred to the apple show, where a reservation has been made for it.

MORE RIOTS ARE ON TAP IN SPAIN

Official Verification of Execution Will Probably Start Rioting Anew.

LONDON, Oct. 13.—The Madrid correspondent of an Exchange company telegraphed today that Professor Francisco Ferrar, who was convicted of inciting riots recently in Barcelona, was shot this morning at the fortress. The official verification of the execution will probably be the signal for more rioting. Last night the socialists of Paris and London held a mass meeting and denounced Spain. Some newspapers have declared the trial a travesty on justice. Letters threatening the royal family and ministers have been received in connection with Ferrar's imprisonment.

MEDFORD PUTS IT ON PORTLAND

Increase in Postal Receipts Far Greater Than One Portland Boasts of.

OREGONIAN NEWS BUREAU, Washington, Oct. 11.—The percentage of increase of postal receipts at Portland for September as compared to September last year was greater than at any other postoffice in the United States except Seattle and New Haven.

Seattle's big increase is due to the exposition. Portland's increase is stated by the department to be 23.89 per cent, or \$12,910.

Evidently only first-class postoffices were considered in the above dispatch, which appeared in Tues-

day's Oregonian, but the statement remains "greater than at any other postoffice in the United States."

Medford's increase in September, 1909, as compared with September, 1908, was 31.76 per cent. For the year ending September 30 the increase over the previous year was 32.21 per cent.

Portland, may rank third among first-class postoffices, but Medford shows far greater growth.

A fast mail train between Chicago and Portland that will bring mail to Oregon in much less time than is now required has just been put on by the Harriman lines. The train will carry no passengers and will make its run between the two cities in 69 or 62 hours, clipping off from 10 to 12 hours from the present schedule. In this way the Harriman lines expect to meet the shortened schedules of the Hill roads, which have been put in fast trains from St. Paul to Pudget Sound.
