- Spraying just as the buds are + swelling in spring is useless as a preventative of peach fruit-spot. This however is the most important application for the control of the peach leaf curl and should not be omitted if this disease has been prev-
- Peach fruit-spot attacks the fruit between about May 10 and June
- 8. The first spring spraying therefore should be done about May 10; the second about June 1. If the disease has been unusually prevelent, or if rainy weather to the growth of the fungus occurs, theh second applieation may be made about May 20 to 25 and a third one about June 5 to

NEW RULES OUT FOR ON PEACH SPOT MORTALITY STATISTICS

Deaths Will Hereafter Be Made.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 15.-United after conducting investigations re. States Census Director E. Dana Durand today promulgated new rules and instructions for the purpose of securing more complete and accurate the following conclusions are transcripts of deaths occurring in the selected death registration states 1.
