Weather fine but cold. Only fair attendance at sale.

Not much life to the market this morning, the trade all having stocks on hand, and with grapes still in liberal receipt, market eased off a little. Our Florin showed some decay, averaged \$1.11; Lodi, \$1.05; Mayhews, \$1.12. Six cars of Malagas in sale; our average \$1.07. Cornichons averaged \$1.21. Assorted \$1.20.

Two cars of Italians, selling \$1.12 to \$1.37 1/2, mostly \$1.12 1/2 to \$1.25. Size ran 6x6.

Full and winter pears in liberal receipt. Block's 1/2 Nellis sold \$2.10; half boxes G. Moreau \$1.25. P. Barrys, \$1.15 to \$1.75. Clairgeau, \$1.25. Boxes of Oregon Conice sold for \$3; half boxes withdrawn.

Car of California Bellflowers sold \$1.12 1/2 to \$1.25.

Few California Levi Clings sold here today at 85c to 90c.

## SEASON NEARLY AT ITS CLOSE

The status of the California fruit crop on October 19 was as follows: The following gives the number of cars of deciduous fruit shipped to all points for the week (seven days) ending Monday night, October 18:

Pears, nine cars—Very little left of this variety now. Grapes, 479 cars—As predicted last week, grape shipments have been liberal in quantity during the past seven days. Malagas are almost out of the market, Tokays constituting the bulk of the shipments. A few Cornichon and Emperor are now moving and will increase in quantity from day to day. Quality of the Cornichon is generally fine.

Last week's report of shortage of Emperors is confirmed by later advices, and it is probable that the yield will not be over one-third of a full crop.

Weather—Since our last report the weather has been fine until today, when a smart shower fell during the morning. It is now clearing, and prospect is good for sunshine.

Demand for grapes is very good, and we advise the trade to place their orders early. We can accept orders for Tokay shipment subject to weather conditions only, as the season may be brought to a close at any time by a heavy storm.
