In the recent conference between Senators Chamberlain and Bourne with members of the Portland Chamber of Commerce, both gentlemen declared their intention during the con sideration of the rivers and harbors bill before the coming congress, to seek liberal appropriations for Oregon rivers and harbors, and named specifically , with others, those ports referred to in your editorial.

Mr. Chamberlain has been a senator of the United States a short time, over eight months, and that during a special session wherein no legislation was considered other than that relating to the census and the tariff.
