THAT RACE COURSE PROPOSITION.

To secure the fair at this place, Ashland has to contend with the energetic opposition of her neighbors, Medford and Jacksonville, and, unless action is at once begun, she will stand no show at all.

A communication to T. E. Hills, Pres. of the Fair Association this year, from a prominent horseman, stating that a well kept half mile track is to be preferred to a mile track, if it be but poorly kept, will undoubtedly determine the size of the course that will be constructed.

In a matter of this nature, the hearty co-operation of all interested is essential to success, and every citizen of Ashland should incline his efforts in that direction.

Ashland vs. the Normal.
