MONDAY, OCTOBER 5.

Regular meeting.—Present: J. P. Dodge, Mayor, Councilmen D. F. Fox, C. H. Gillette, W. J. Schmidt, C. H. Vaupel: absent; W. B. Million, C. B. Crisler.

Usual monthly reports of City officers read and placed on file.

Quarterly reports of City treasurer and sexton of cemetery, read and approved.

On motion of C. H. Gillette it was ordered that a City warrant be drawn for the sum of \$75 in favor of E. V. Carter for money advanced to C. B. Watson for services and expenses as attorney for the City in U. S. court at S. F.

Bills to the amount of \$253.90 were approved and ordered paid.
