Medford's Barbecue.

The republican barbecue at Medford last Saturday was largely attended by people from all points of the valley. Medford residents said it was the largest crowd they had ever entertained. The attendance is estimated at from 8,000 to 10,000. Excursion cars were run from Grant's Pass and Jacksonville. Ashland was well represented.

The barbecue dinner was a success in all respects. Two beeves and two sheep were broiled, and in addition to a large supply of bread and pickles, made a good noon day meal for the crowd.

The program of the afternoon consisted of campaign speeches and music. The speakers were able politicians, and stirred up the free silver element in grand style. The Jacksonville and Grant's Pass glee clubs favored the people with several selections. A torch-light procession was the evening attraction, after which a social dance ended the amusements.

Altogether, it was a big day for McKinley, and as an exchange says, the question of the people's choice no longer excites comment; it is only a problem of how large McKinleys majority will be.
