Asenath Ricker was born in Milton, Strafford County, New Hampshire, October 29, 1814, being the oldest of a family of four children. At the age of 45 years, she married Thomas R. Warren, of the same town. Shortly after, they moved to Lebanon, Maine. After her husband's death, in 1886, she went to Nebraska. In 1894, she came from Central Nebraska to this place, where she has made her home, most of the time, with her nephew. Her death last Sunday evening, at 9:30 o'clock, was the result of a severe illness last summer.
