

the results of three years' constant labor in the arrest of E. Bates Soper, alias Homer Lee, in Ashland last Wednesday night. The detective recognized his man at sight, and placed him in custody to answer to the charge of murdering his wife and two children in Cass county, Missouri, April 21, 1891.

Soper confessed the crime to Detective Lowe, and the only extenuation offered is that he was unable to educate the children and give them such advantages as he desired, and preferred relieving them from misery by taking their lives. The excuse for killing his wife is that he did not wish her to share the disgrace of his act.

Detective Lowe says it is reported in the neighborhood where Soper lived in Missouri that he and his wife quarreled over the latter joining the church, a short time before the tripple murder took place. Soper is said to be a spiritualist, and objected to his wife joining the Christian church.

On leaving Missouri, Soper covered his tracks well. A man's body was dragged out of the Missouri river near Kansas City which was reported to be that of Soper. The body was identified by a witness before a coroner's jury as
