On the second Monday in November, 1857, the present constitution of Oregon was ratified by a majority vote of the electors of the territory, and the act of congress admitting Oregon into the Union was approved February 14, 1859, on which date the constitution went into effect. In Sec. 3, Art. XIV, this constitution says: All the public institutions of the state, hereafter provided for by the legislative assembly, shall be located at the seat of government. In 1864 the seat of government was located at Salem for the term of twenty years, to remain there until by majority vote removed. We give the above facts to prepare our readers for what is to follow in the matter of legal proceedings which are of very great importance to this city.

Last January the legislature of Oregon was in session and made a number of appropriations in aid of state institutions. Among others, for which money was appropriated, was the building and maintaining of a soldiers' home at Roseburg, Oregon. Money was also appropriated for a branch insane asylum in Eastern Oregon, also a normal school, also for enlarging the Reform school near Turner, in Marion county, also to pay teachers in the normal school here. Shortly after the legislature adjourned an injunction suit was commenced by one D. T. Sherman, of Salem, supposedly a tool of Salem parties, to restrain the appropriation of the public money for a public institution at any other place in Oregon than at Salem. Last week Judge Burnett granted the injunction, and the case has now gone to the supreme court. Should the supreme court sustain Judge Burnett's decision our readers may be prepared for a very serious state of affairs. The people of Roseburg and Pendleton have united funds and propose to enjoin the payment of any money to any public institution outside the state capital. The result will be that the normal school at this place cannot open its doors next fall, neither can the Agricultural college at Corvallis nor the State university at Eugene nor the Reform school above Salem, besides other minor institutions.

The decision of the supreme court of Oregon will be watched with much interest. We are locally affected by its decision.

Sound Money.

J. B. Henderson, of Iowa, has offered a remedy for the financial troubles of the day. Here it is:

First—Custom duties should hereafter be paid in gold alone.

Second—Silver bullion in the government vaults should at once be sold for cash in gold and the proceeds covered into the treasury.

Third—Three per cent gold bonds to the amount of \$300,000,000 should be promptly sold and the proceeds transferred to the treasury.

Fourth—A day should be fixed, not later than January 1, 1898 for the redemption and payment in gold coin of all outstanding notes of any kind and all other obligations issued by the government.

At least half the silver dollars under the acts of 1878 and 1890 should be added as bullion, and the remainder melted into subsidiary silver

coins, and made legal tender only in payments of \$10 or less.

Sixth—Provision should be made for the use of \$500,000,000 in gold bonds as the basis for banking, making provisions, as liberal as possible, consistent with safety, but under government supervision.

Seventh—The basis of national banking should be so enlarged as to permit the issue of circulating notes on the deposit of other than United States bonds, the solvency of such bonds to be passed on by responsible government officials.

Eighth—All bank issues to be redeemed in gold coin on demand.

Ninth—All foreign gold coins should be made a legal tender for debt and receivable for government duties at a value fixed by law.

Tenth—Previous to January 1, 1890, the surplus funds of the treasury, received from loans or collections, to be placed with the banks in such sections of the country and in such amounts as may be determined by the secretary.
