Good reports are constantly reaching me of the American colony established in the department of Matagalpa. This section is about 100 miles from Leon. and is destined to be a great coffee region. The Manning Bros., of which Charles Manning, the head of the firm was at one time a resident of Tacoms have a finca of 500 manganas, nearly 1000 acres. This year they have plant ing 200 pineapples, 100 apple trees, vegetables seeds of various kinds, bananas and plantains. The Manning Bree. whose place adjoins theirs, and contains 1000 acres. Mr. Rice represents a company that intends making a very large coffee fluca. Another American who is branching out extensively is W \$12,000, silver, a place near the city of Matagalpa, and from which he will shortly derive a yearly income almost Mr. Hawkins contracted for this plantation when exchange was 60 percent. and paid for it when exchange was 85 per cent , thus making a saving of \$1014


