Restored to Health and Vigor in **Red Cross Convalescent** Homes.

The surgeon has extracted the impartially distributed bits of shrapnel from your works. The wounds have healed. The wheels go 'round again, and the clock ticks.

But it doesn't keep correct time. This business of calling "Time!" on the Boche means so many broken clocks nowadays that the master-menders can't keep them on their tables after they're mended. So the question where

they shall sit around while they're being regulated looms large. The Red Cross answers that question with its convalescent homes. It has six of these in operation. A suitable place is found-sometimes donated-and management and equipment are provided by the Red Cross, while the Army has furnished discipline and a never-failing supply of con-

valescents. These homes mean that men who are scarcely hospital subjects, yet who can by no means go back to their duties, have a place that does what "home" does for the French or English soldier, what "home" does for any one, in fact, when the doctor gets
