Figuring Weight of Ice. A very close estimate of the weight of any block of ice may be ascertained by applying the following method: The volume of the ice in cubic inches is obtained by multiplying together the three dimensions. Dividing the product by 30 gives the weight of the ice in pounds. For instance, if the block is 10 by 10 by 12 inches, its volume is 1,200 cubic inches; dividing this product by 30 gives 40 pounds as the correct weight of the ice.

Snakes in the Ocean. It is not generally known that there are snakes in the ocean. There are numerous varieties of small snakes that live in all oceans; then there are the eels, of course, which go from the salt water to the fresh. In the waters around southern Asia there lives the banded sea snake, which has stripes around its body and broad tail, and can swim with great speed.—Christian Science Monitor.

Wire's Long Stretch. While S. E. Wharton of Boston was traveling in Switzerland his attention was called to the longest unsupported telegraph wire he had ever seen. It crosses in one span the Lake of Wallenstadt, being fastened to two iron towers which are almost 3,000 feet apart. The line is made of steel and that section of it closest to the lake is more than 100 feet above the surface of the water.

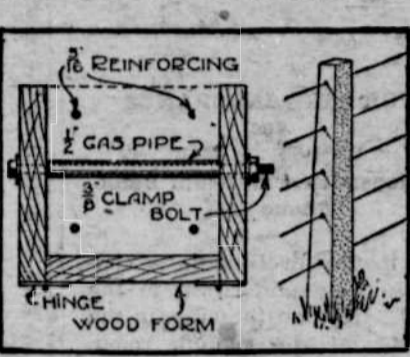

Orchard Information

POSTS FOR GRAPE TRELLIS

Directions and Illustrations Given for Construction of Substantial Supports.

It is an easy matter to make concrete posts for the grape trellis, or farm fence. For a grape trellis make the posts ten feet long so that you can set them four feet underground. The butts should be six inches square and the tops four inches. At equal distances apart through the posts are set one-half inch pipes so that you can run wires through them. The illustration shows how the forms are made. A three-eighths inch bolt runs through the pipes so that the forms will be clamped well and the concrete will not bulge. Mix the concrete with one part cement, two and one-half parts clean sand and three parts well

graded gravel. Place four rods, one in each corner for re-enforcing. These rods should be at least five-sixteenths inch in diameter. For the end posts you should have three-eighths inch eye bolts to run through the pipes in the post. This will enable you to fasten the wires securely and also to tighten them.—W. E. Frudden in Popular Science Monthly.

PAYS TO MULCH AN ORCHARD

Particularly Satisfactory Means of Solving Soil Management and Protects Roots.

Without doubt, a comparatively large percentage of the commercial orchard area of the state should be plowed each year and the clean culture cover crop method of soil management be employed, says V. R. Gardner of the University of Missouri college of agriculture. However, there are many orchards, or at least certain portions of many orchards, planted on slopes so steep as to render clean culture impracticable on account of the danger from washing. Such orchard areas should be mulched artificially in order to check the running off of the water at times of heavy rainfall. Check evaporation from the soil at all times of the year, and in other ways contribute to the vegetative growth and productivity of the trees. Trees properly mulched will be found much more productive and profitable than those left to compete with weeds and grass for water and food. As a matter of fact artificial mulching is a very satisfactory substitute for cultivation and an entirely practicable method of soil management under many conditions. Straw, cornstalks or other similar organic material that will cover the ground and that may be obtained at little or no cost, except for handling, is suitable to use for mulching purposes. In a general way, it may be stated that the thicker the mulch the better. A layer at least four inches deep should be applied, and in later years as the roots away more should be added. Mulching is a particularly satisfactory means of solving the soil management problem in the small home orchard that otherwise is apt to be more or less neglected in this respect. Attention may also be called to the fact that the application of mulching material now, rather than later, will serve to protect the ground from such deep freezing and may be the means of considerably reducing winter injury of the roots.

SPRAY FOR INFECTED TREES

Recommended by Ohio Experiment Station to Control Canker Worms—Use Arsenate of Lead.

Spraying trees in early spring with arsenate of lead is recommended by the Ohio experiment station to control canker worms, or measuring worms, as they are frequently called. If infested trees having their largest leaves about an inch long are thoroughly sprayed with five or six pounds of arsenate of lead paste (or half as much of the powdered form) to 50 gallons of water, many of the worms will die from eating the poison, while others refusing to eat will enter the ground before they are full grown and fall to complete their life cycle. These black worms, having a narrow yellow stripe on each side of the body, often defoliate orchards and forest trees in May and June. The apple is the most common host. Linden, young chestnut, ash, maple, red oak and elm are also frequently attacked by the young larvae, which hatch in early spring. They inflict greatest injury in the tops of trees, and therefore sprays must be directed to reach the topmost twigs and branches.

The boundary line between the United States and Canada runs through the center of each of the four border lakes that lie along or between the two countries, and jurisdiction over the lakes is shared. There is a permanent international waterways commission, consisting of three Americans and three Canadians, that has control of the use of the waters of the lakes for power and other purposes.
