SAVING DISTANCE

(From the Portland Journal.) In connection with highway development it is noted that the cost of construction of main trunk roads is becoming secondary to the consideration of securing the shortest and most direct route. The old practice was to follow the old established lines in order to save the cost of new right of way, new bridges and cuts and fills. Today the tendency is to connect centers of population by the shortest distance even though it involves an entirely new construction. The reason for this is that the cost of construction of road is of far less importance than the cost of the operation. For example, if the conservative sum of 10 cents per mile is allowed

for each mile of travel saved, the saving of a mile in distance becomes a large item.

On a road which has an average number of 100 vehicles per day the saving to users for a year would amount to \$3650. This saving would be the interest at 5 per cent on \$73,000. If the road was used by an average of 500 vehicles a day the saving would be \$18,250, or, capitalized at 5 per cent, \$365,000.

These figures demonstrate that in building main highways there is good reason for making a saving in distance the chief consideration.

BE SURE AIR VENT IS OPEN

This is to Allow Gasoline to Flow into Carburetor From Bottom of Supply Tank.

In the cap on the filler hole in a gravity feed tank you will usually find a small hole. This is to allow air to enter at the top so that the gasoline can flow into the carburetor from the bottom. If gasoline fails to reach the carburetor, though there is plenty in the tank, make sure that this air vent is open, before trying to locate a stoppage in the line.

BIG BATTLESHIPS.

The stay of the battle cruiser Renown in our waters, says the Scientific American, has raised a discussion as to which are the longest ships afloat. Of course, among merchant ships the Leviathan, 950 feet long, is the longest, with the Imperator and the Aquitania, each 900 feet long, of the Cunard line, coming next. Among warships, the longest in commission today are the Renown and her sister, the Repulse, each being 789 feet. But the longest warship constructed and soon to go into commission, is the British battle cruiser Hood, which is 900 feet in length and about 42,000 tons full load displacement. Our navy department has designed six battle cruisers 875 feet in length.

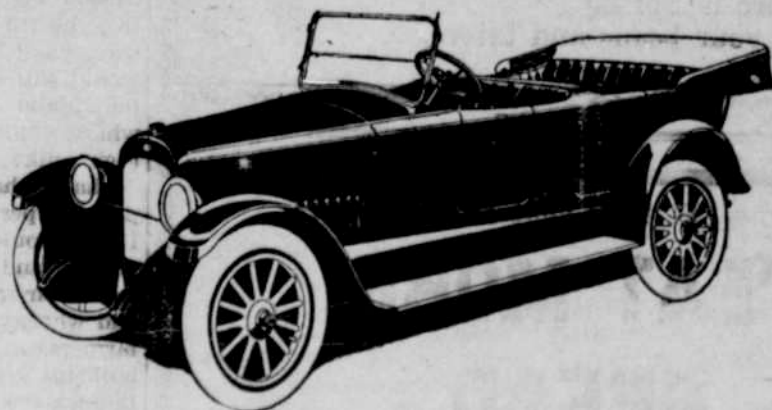
