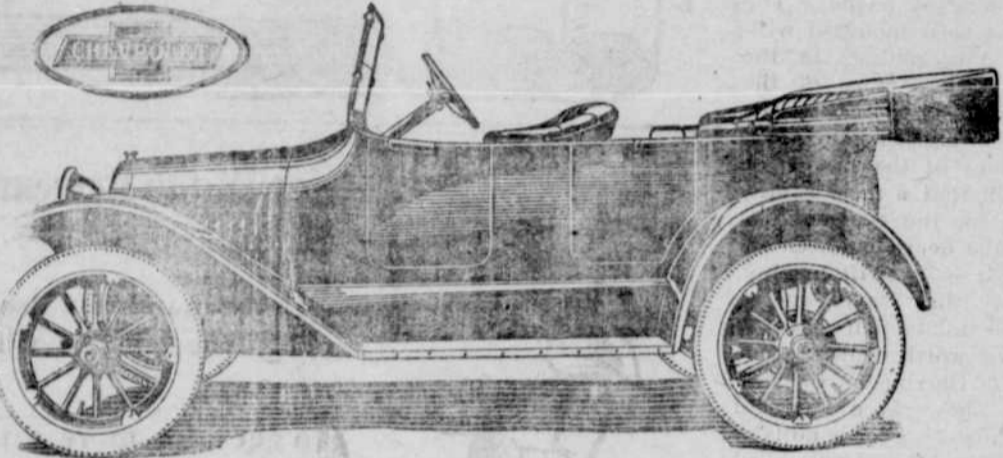

more than double those of the same month of 1918, according to the monthly report of the Bureau of Internal Revenue, and were nearly \$2,000,000 greater than those collected during the preceding month. A total of \$7,268,688.41 was turned into the government during the month, according to Commissioner Daniel C. Roper, as compared with \$5,877,692.43 during the month of November and \$3,453,747.94 during December, 1918.

Rentals of moving picture films netted the government \$435,454.80 during the month, as compared with \$302,506.66 in November, while in addition, \$275,409.94 was received from the seating tax, a decided increase over the \$59,364.76 reported for November.

Total collections for the month were \$1,030,684,083.41 as compared with \$163,736,294.48 for November, and \$193,997,066.65 in December, 1918.

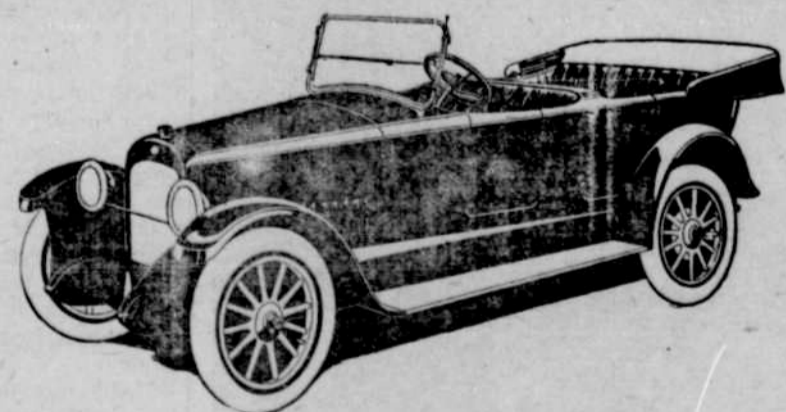
