CHEVROLET ECONOMICAL CAR

Mal Richardson of Snowflake, Ariz., claims an economy record for touring in a Chevrolet car. The day he was discharged from the army Mr. Richardson purchased his first automobile, a Chevrolet 4-90. Next day he started on a trip from Holbrook to Salt Lake City, with a complete camping outfit and three passengers. His expense for the trip was \$9.

Mr. Richardson remained at Salt Lake City for some time, and returned with five grown people in

the car and total of 1250 pounds of baggage and camping equipment. The return trip was made by way of Nevada, over some of the poorest roads to be found in the west, at a total expense of \$12.

According to Mr. Richardson, he covered about 3000 miles of the poorest roads Nevada, Utah and Arizona have to offer, averaging almost 24 miles to the gallon and more than 1000 miles per gallon on oil. The original tires made the round trip and are still good.

A POLITICAL REMINISCENCE

Writing to the Portland Journal from McMinnville, J. C. Cooper says: "When I came to Oregon, in 1856, politics was like love and war—everything was fair.
