ments, having sustained a loss only once. He states that he averages 60 per cent hatch from all the eggs set, and that in twenty one days the eggs hatched more than double one's money. To a novice the manner of rolling and cooling, saturating and contriving "air space" is truly interesting. "The severe cold weather," the Dr. said, "did not effect my birds badly for in January, from 320 hens I sold 540 dozen eggs, receiving \$320.00 for same." We began to think fruit growers, rather than poultry growers, suffered from the winter's severity. The Dugannes have just received a fine bull dog from Dr. Watts of Portland. The dog will act as guard over the flock of birds at the home. We thought it well that the Doctor does not have his chickens and watch dog "below the Mason and Dixon line" as some "coons" would likely have some cloth removed from the seat of their trousers. The dog need not discourage visitors, however, as the Dugannes find great pleasure in expaining the merits of their successful industry.
